


On a cool summer evening, two Nigerian-American girls sit in their Boston apartment and discuss their life plans:




















The men make all the decisions; you just cook and serve the jollof. You don't even decide what to cook; the older wives in the family direct you.





You thought. You'll be lucky if some kola nut gets to you after the titled men, older men, younger men, titled women, and older women all get some.




And palm wine? Forget it.

Fine. I hear what you're saying, but I'll just put my own spin on tradition. And do things my way.




Are you crazy? No one will respect that marriage!




What do you mean?!
